Channel Christian School is a growing coeducational school providing the highest quality Christ-centred education for students from Kindergarten through to Year 6. Student Achievement

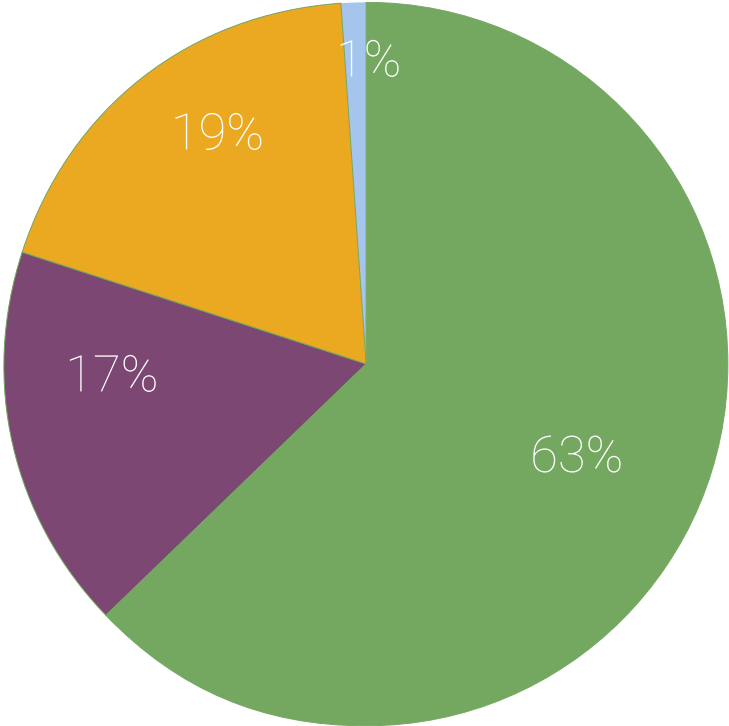
